Caladh Avenue Coastal Protection Project

The Caladh Avenue Coastal Protection Project has seen extensive reconstruction over the past year, strengthening coastal defenses and improving the waterfront road network along Caladh Avenue from behind the former Consulate Inn on the Jitney Trail to Coleraine Street. Key upgrades include raising the roadway to 2 metres above sea level between Commercial Street and Market Street, installing new sidewalks and lighting, extending the boardwalk from Market Wharf to Coleraine Street, resurfacing asphalt, and adding a multi-use pathway with a bike lane on the south side of the street. The street has also been converted to a one-way westbound route, creating a downtown traffic loop supported by new parking signage to improve access to public parking.

This important infrastructure investment enhances connectivity across roads and trails while strengthening protection for both public and private property along a vulnerable waterfront floodplain, helping the community better adapt to increasingly severe weather and long-term sea level rise.

Jitney Trail Wall Project

The Town of Pictou will be undertaking important work on the retaining wall along the Jitney Trail, which has deteriorated significantly and requires immediate reinstatement to ensure public safety and preserve the integrity of the trail infrastructure.

Construction is scheduled to begin no earlier than September 1st and is anticipated to take at least two months, with a late fall completion expected. If re-routing is required during construction, traffic will be directed via Willow Street to Water Street. Any temporary closure of this section of Water Street will depend on an approved safety plan. The goal throughout planning and construction is to minimize impacts to vehicle traffic as much as possible.

Further updates, including detailed traffic management information, will be shared later this summer prior to the start of construction.

Fitness Trail Project

This summer, work on our woodland trails will restore and improve connection to the system. Improvements will include clearing and surfacing approximately .5kms of original trail, increasing accessibility and the installation of new trailhead and wayfinding signs.

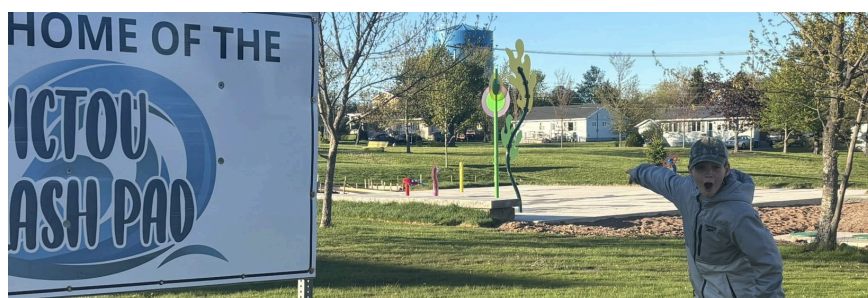
The Town is continuing to pursue opportunities and partnerships to support the long-term restoration of the forest impacted by Hurricane Fiona and the removal of storm debris. While recovery will take time, encouraging progress is already visible throughout the site. Significant natural regrowth is underway, with many saplings now reaching heights of over five feet. A fall 2025 funding partnership with the Trans Canada Trail Foundation supported a planting of native species in the affected area by the McCulloch Education Centre Garden Club. We are happy to report that our new trees survived the winter and are thriving!

Community Centre at Broidy Park

Construction continues on the new community centre at Broidy Park, which will provide a welcoming gathering space for recreational activities and flexible community use, including a kitchen. The new facility will be fully accessible and is anticipated to be completed by mid-summer. The centre will also serve as the home base for the Pictou Recreation Day Camp Program during the summer months and will be available for community use year round.

Splash Pad Update

Big changes are happening at Broidy Park this summer with the new splash pad project! Colourful and interactive water features were installed this spring, and ground work and servicing for the splash pad are well underway. Updates on commissioning and the official opening will be announced soon. Keep watch online for updates!



Market Wharf Construction and Marina Project

The Town of Pictou continues to make progress on the transformative \$12.5 million Market Wharf Breakwater and Marina Expansion Project, with construction remaining on schedule for reopening in the 2027 season. Since construction began in November 2024, work has continued on rebuilding Market Wharf and constructing a new breakwater that will help shape Pictou into a first-class waterfront destination.

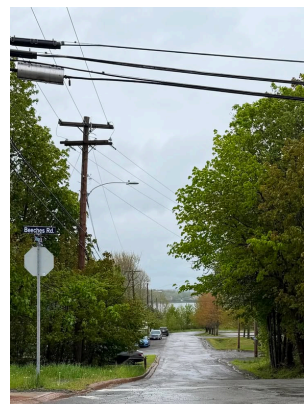
Once complete, the expanded marina will accommodate both small watercraft and larger vessels, and will feature modern amenities including a fueling station, upgraded water and electrical services, and on-site sewage disposal facilities. As part of the project’s marketing strategy, the Town has also contracted Vibe Creative Group to develop new branding and a refreshed name for the marina facility. Updates on boater registration and future developments will be shared later this summer.

Municipal Climate Action Plan

Following approval by Council, the Town of Pictou has officially adopted an updated Municipal Climate Change Action Plan (MCCAP), which will help guide future municipal decision-making related to climate adaptation, sustainability, infrastructure, emergency preparedness, and long-term community resilience. The MCCAP outlines key priorities, actions, and recommendations aimed at addressing the impacts of climate change locally while supporting a healthy, sustainable, and resilient community for current and future residents. The plan also recognizes and celebrates the many past and ongoing initiatives the Town has undertaken to support environmental stewardship and community sustainability.

Street Paving and Servicing

The Town of Pictou maintains 37.8 km of paved streets and 2 km of gravel streets, classified as local, collector, or arterial. The 2024 Street Assessment Report outlines conditions and guides capital planning for the next couple of years. For 2026–27, resurfacing and new service line work includes Union Street between Dawson and Denoon Street. You may view the Street Assessment Report on the Town website.

Town of Pictou Opening Streets to Off-Highway Vehicles

In spring 2023, the Province of Nova Scotia passed Bill 273, the “Road Trails Act,” giving municipalities such as the Town of Pictou the authority to create bylaws allowing off-highway vehicles (OHVs) that meet provincial requirements to legally access designated roads.

In April 2025, the Town introduced amendments to its OHV By-Law to allow approved OHVs access to specific streets within the downtown and waterfront district. Following the pilot project and feedback received from residents and the public over the past year, Council reviewed the initiative at the May 4, 2026 Committee of Council Meeting, discussing both the benefits and concerns related to expanded OHV access.

At the May 4th meeting, Council also reviewed draft amendments that would expand OHV access to all streets and roads within the Town of Pictou. First Reading of the proposed by-law amendments was passed at the Regular Council Meeting on May 19, 2026, followed by a proposed Second/Final Reading on June 15, 2026.

2026 Low Income Tax Exemption Application

The Town of Pictou is currently accepting applications for partial residential property tax exemption. Applications can be filed up to December 22, 2026 on forms supplied by the Town. Application forms can be found at www.townofpictou.ca or can be picked up at the Town Office at 40 Water St.

Partial exemptions can be granted to owners/principal residents of homes of up to \$495 in situations where the total income of all residents over the age of 18 in the household was under \$30,960 for 2025.

Sewer Charges Moving from Tax Bills to Water Bills

Beginning with the June 30 water billing cycle, sewer charges for properties in the Town of Pictou will now appear on water bills for the first time. Previously, sewer charges were included on annual property tax bills as a flat per-household rate. The Town is moving to a usage-based system that more fairly reflects the amount of wastewater entering the sewer system. Under the new structure, properties that use more water and therefore place greater demand on the sewer system will pay more, while lower-use properties will pay less.

For most residents, the reduction in sewer charges previously collected through the tax bill is expected to be approximately equal to the new sewer charges appearing on water bills over the course of the year.

Residents will notice that the addition of sewer charges will increase water bills by approximately 60%.

The new sewer rates are:

- Sewer Operating Charge: \$1.82 per cubic metre (m³) of water usage
- Sewer Capital Charge: Based on water meter size

This change helps create a more equitable and sustainable approach to funding sewer operations and future infrastructure investments.

WILD FIRE PREVENTION

Nova Scotia is in the heart of wildfire season. Weather is getting warmer and dryer, putting us at greater risk this time of year.

In Nova Scotia, almost all wildfires are caused by people, so prevention is our first line of defence. Wildfire prevention is everyone's responsibility. Let's not have another season like last year. Learn about preventing wildfire at: www.novascotia.ca/burnsafe/.

During wildfire season, burn restrictions apply to domestic open fire burning. This includes: campfires, burn pits, brush burning, backyard fires and bonfires, backyard chiminea and similar appliances.

Please follow the daily burn restrictions at www.novascotia.ca/burnsafe/ and don't start the next wildfire.

FIREWORKS

Did you know you need permission to set off fireworks within Town limits? For details, please call **(902) 485-4372** or email **info@townofpictou.ca**. When using fireworks, consider the community impact. Fireworks, as beautiful as they are, have an impact on our neighbours, environment, and animals. Once permission is granted, residents are encouraged to inform neighbours in advance of their use.

BURNING PERMITS

Residents are required to obtain a burn permit from the Fire Chief for most outdoor burning activities that go beyond small recreational fires. Permits cost \$5.00 and allow burning between 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. Approved materials include sticks, brush, stumps, slash, and insect-infested wood. Permits help ensure fires are done safely and in a way that does not create a nuisance for neighbours or a risk to the community.
